• How does Ariana Grande's visit to the hospital reflect this image of God's love? Write your answer in your copy.

Discussion

Activity

Read Matthew 28:1–10. Imagine you are one of Jesus' disciples. You are devastated by his death. All your hopes and dreams are shattered. You are lonely for Jesus but also terrified that you too may be arrested for being one of his followers.

• Write the story of your reaction when you find that Jesus is alive, that he has risen from the dead.



Extension Exercise


How do you think Jesus' Resurrection makes a difference in our lives today? Write your thoughts in your copy.
