Prayer moment

Let us take a moment to remember all the people in our school. (pause)

When we talk to God, we pray.

We begin by blessing ourselves: In the name of the Father... (Repeat after teacher)

Loving God, hear our prayer;

Keep everyone in our school in your loving care Today and always.

Amen.

Explore: How we belong in our school

- List all the different activities that we take part in during the day.
- Recall events/activities that we are involved in as a whole school/class group.
- Consider our favourite activities.
- Who might visit our school?
- How do we treat each other in our school? at play? outside? in the classroom?
- How do we treat the environment in our school?

Reflect

In our Catholic school we learn to live like Jesus. We remember what Jesus has taught us about loving God our Father. When we love each other we are sharing God's love. Jesus teaches us to be kind and helpful.

He teaches us to always show respect to each other and to the world that God has created for us. Every day we pray. When do we pray in our school? What is your favourite prayer? Jesus taught us to pray to God our Father. We pray together:


Write, print or draw your favourite prayer, decorate it and display it.

Consider: The Community we Live In

A community is a group of people who live together and care for each other. Make a list of all the different people who care for us in our community. Chat about how they show that they care for us.

Prayer moment

In the name of the Father...
(Repeat after teacher)
God our Father,
Thank you for all the people who care for me in our community.
Help me to show that I care for them too.
Amen.

Explore

We also care for others in our community.

In our family we are loving and respectful.

In our school community we are kind and helpful.

In our parish community we pray for each other and celebrate together in the church. Explore how we care for:

- each other in the community groups that the children may belong to.
- those who are not part of our local community (e.g. donations, prayers, fundraising).
- the environment (e.g. Green Flag initiatives, litter pick, recycling etc)

Reflect

We also belong to a special community that is called God's family. At Mass, God's family comes together to say thank you for the gift of Jesus. When is Mass celebrated in your community? We also say thank you when we pray. When do we pray? Who do we pray for? What will we thank God for today?

Teacher Tip: you may wish to revise the daily prayers eg. Morning Prayer, Grace before and after Meals, Night Prayer, etc.


