The Church is a special place where God's people gather to pray. Our family helps us become friends of Jesus. The priest/teacher helps us to become friends of Jesus (LG 10). Mass Special times and places the Church family gathers to pray and celebrate Mass (e.g. Christmas day). On Sunday Catholics gather together to celebrate the Mass (CCC 1167, 1343).

Consider: Our Catholic school

What is the name of our school? What days do we come to school? List all the things we do in our school. What is your favourite activity in school?

Prayer moment

Let us take a moment to remember all the people in our school. (pause)

When we talk to God, we pray.

We begin by blessing ourselves: In the name of the Father...

(Repeat after teacher)

Loving God, hear our prayer;

Keep everyone in our school in your loving care, Today and always, Amen

Explore: How we belong in our school

- Every day we take part in many activities.
- Sometimes we do new things and sometimes we do the same things.
- Think of the things we do every day (e.g. take off our coats, eat lunch, use pencils, play on the yard, etc.)
- In our school we also talk to God every day.
- When we talk to God, we say our prayers.
- What is your favourite prayer?

Reflect

Jesus taught his friends to pray to God our Father. We can say this prayer together:

Our Father, who art in heaven...

In our Catholic school we learn to live like Jesus. We remember what Jesus has taught us about loving God our Father. When we love each other we are sharing God's love. Jesus teaches us to be kind and helpful. He teaches us to always show respect to each other and to the world that God has created for us.

Act

Recall the children's favourite story about Jesus.




Teacher Tip: You may wish to choose from the following:

Prayer moment

We bless ourselves: In the name of the Father... (Repeat after teacher) Loving God, hear our prayer; Keep our school family in your loving care, Today and always. Amen.



Pope Francis, who visited Ireland last August, reminds us to always say 'please', 'thank you' and 'I am sorry'. This week we will try to use these words every day.

Explore

What would you say if:

- you bumped into another child in the yard by accident?
- a child shared their activity with you?
- you wanted to use a crayon that someone else had?

Reflect


Think about all the times today we can say please, thank you and I am sorry.

- When would you say please? thank you? I am sorry?
- Who would you be talking to?
- Why would you say please? thank you? I am sorry?

Act

God has given each of us a guardian angel to look after us. We say thank you to God for this special gift. We pray: Angel sent by God to guide me ...

Thursday: Our Catholic School in Service of our Community 31 January 2019

Consider the community we live in

A community is a group of people who live together and care for each other. Make a list of all the different people who care for us in our community. (Lollypop person, school caretaker, school secretary, bus driver, priest, hairdresser, shop assistant, dentist, doctor, nurse, librarian, etc.)

Play 'Who am I?'

A child explains their 'job' in the community to the class and finishes by asking 'Who am I?'



Teacher Tip: it may be necessary to prompt the child before they play.

e.g. I collect the children in my bus and drive them to school in the morning and back home in the afternoon. Who am I?

- I examine the children's teeth and remind them to brush their teeth every day. Who am I?
- I take care of the school building and the grounds around the school. Who am I?
- I say Mass in the church. Who am I?

Prayer moment

In the name of the Father... (Repeat after teacher) God our Father, Thank you for all the people who care for me in our community. Amen.

Explore: Our school is a community

In our school we work together, we play together and we learn together. We care for each other and we respect each other. Jesus teaches us to love everyone. Sometimes we help others who are not in our school. Can you think of a time when we shared with others?



Teacher Tip: Consider initiatives that the class or the school may have been involved in, e.g. fundraising.

Who did we share with? Where?/ Why? / When?

- Did we pray for others?
- Did we raise money for others?
- Did we donate something to others?

Reflect


Today we will remember to say please and thank you to those we meet in our community. We also say thank you to God when we pray. Remember to pray before and after we eat today. (Grace before and after Meals)

Act

Friday: Supporting Faith in Our Catholic School 1 February 2019, Feast of St Brigid

Faith makes us open to the quiet presence of God at every moment of our lives, in every person and in every situation. God is present in every one of you, in each one of us. Pope Francis, New York, September 2015.

Consider: When something very special happens we celebrate

There are lots of different ways of celebrating. Chat to each other about something that you celebrated. Remember what you were celebrating. Was it a birthday/a wedding/a win/a christening/a special occasion, etc? Who was there? How did you know it was a celebration? How did people feel? Was there special food? Did anyone wear special clothes? Were there decorations?

Prayer moment

In the name of the Father... (Repeat after teacher) God our Father, Thank you for all the times we celebrate. Amen.

Explore

Sometimes we celebrate at home and sometimes we celebrate in school. Sometimes we go to the church to celebrate.

When we go to the church we celebrate that God loves us so much. We listen to stories about God. We remember that God sent Jesus to show us his love.

When we see a cross it helps us to remember that God has promised to love us for ever.



Teacher note: This may be an opportunity to visit the local church.

Today we celebrate St Brigid's feast day.

Saint Brigid made a cross from reeds. Saint Brigid helped people to learn that God loved them very much. Today, we can colour/decorate a St Brigid's cross to remember that God loves us.

Act Sing 'A Song to Brigid' (Grow in Love, Senior Infants, Them 5 Lesson 1)
