Board of Management/Governors and Staff Reflection

The following is offered as a basis for a short reflection on Catholic schools with staff and members of Boards of Management/Governors during Catholic Schools Week 2014.

The theme of Catholic Schools Week 2014 is Catholic Schools: Places of Faith and Learning. All Catholic schools must have both of these dimensions to them. If one or other was missing then it would no longer be a Catholic school. However, it is good for us to consider the relationship between the two. Sometimes it is tempting to consign our faith dimension to the time spent in prayer, sacramental preparation, religious education and all the liturgical celebrations that are so much part of the Catholic primary school. Pope Benedict XVI explained the two dimensions of the Catholic school beautifully in his address to children during his visit to the UK in 2010:

'In your Catholic schools, there is always a bigger picture over and above the individual subjects you study, the different skills you learn. All the work you do is placed in the context of growing in friendship with God, and all that flows from that friendship. So you learn not just to be good students, but good citizens, good people. As you move higher up the school, you have to make choices regarding the subjects you study; you begin to specialise with a view to what you are going to do later on in life. That is right and proper. But always remember that every subject you study is part of a bigger picture. Never allow yourselves to become narrow. The world needs good scientists, but a scientific outlook becomes dangerously narrow if it ignores the religious or ethical dimension of life, just as religion becomes narrow if it rejects the legitimate contribution of science to our understanding of the world ... '

In this year's resource we have reflected on these two dimensions through a focus on the following words:

Live: The school as a place where we learn live according to Gospel values

Learn: The school as a place where all our learning is informed by a Catholic

philosophy of education

Share: The school as a place where we learn to share all that we have been

given by God

Celebrate: The school as a place where we celebrate our faith in prayer

Serve: The school as a place where we learn to serve each other, to do as Jesus

did and 'wash each other's feet'.

Staff and Board members might use these words as a basis to begin to reflect on the way the school is living up to its mission of being a place of faith and learning.
